## Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) 2018-19 Academic Year Report Summer Term

Number of Children Eligible for funding Summer Term 2018/19: **21 children**  
 Early Years Pupil Premium (EYPP) Allocation for 2018/19 Summer Term was: £2003.40

### **The EYPP allocation for 2018/2019 Summer Term was targeted to:**

Provide focussed activities led by an experienced practitioner in the Early Years Foundation Stage to 'diminish the difference' and improve levels of attainment across the 17 strands of learning.

**OFSTED (July 2018) "To provide greater opportunities for children to use their skills in reading, writing and mathematics in the outdoor area."**

100% of children in receipt of EYPP received additional support.

The low level of attainment in the majority of strands reflects that the starting point for children entering Nursery was average.

Mark-making (writing) and mathematics were resourced in the Spring Term but Literacy (Reading) is still a focus and new books need to be purchased in order to provide the children with a print-rich environment. More wheeled toys to be purchased to further enhance the outdoor environment.
