Class Topic: Story Tellers

During this topic we will be learning about Traditional Tales. The books we will be covering are; Jack and the Beanstalk, Little Red Riding Hood, The Magic Porridge Pot and other Traditional Tales.

We will be retelling the stories, writing stories and exploring the characters and the setting of the stories. The children will enjoy being story tellers by acting out the

stories using puppets and props.



Knowledge and Understanding of the World

<u>Summer</u> <u>Learning</u> about the seasons will continue throughout the year. We will be learning about seasonal changes and key features of Summer.

We will be also be exploring some technology toys such as the beebots and will use the IWB to help us learn.

Maths:

- Numbers to 20—recognising, ordering, sequencing, finding one more and one less.
- Addition and subtracting.



English:

The children will enjoy listening to and joining in with the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We will sequence the story and label and match pictures and words. Within provision areas, children will have the opportunity to act out the story and complete a range of activities based around the story. Our Verbal story of 'will help to build up the children's story telling skills.

Phonics: We will be continuing to learn letter sounds using the Ruth Miskin Read, Write Inc scheme including lots of digraphs (two letters, one sound) : sh, ch, th, ng, nk, ay, ee, igh, ow, oo.

Physical Development:

- Spiral PE—learning the following skills— attitude, receiving, organising limbs, balance.
- Gross motor skills outdoor play
- Fine motor skills development playdough, funky finger activities, cutting skills

How parents can help at home:

Please keep practising name writing and number writing at home. You could even have go at writing your last name!
