Welcome to all the parents/carers of class 5/6I. I am really excited to be working with your children and families this year. We have lots of exciting learning planned for this half term and we hope the children will be excited to share this with you.

Class Topic:

Our topic this half-term is 'Living on the Edge. As part of this topic we will be using our geographical skills whilst learning all about erosion, weathering, coastal features,



changing coastlines and changing boundaries.

In DT we will also be designing and making our own lighthouse with a working electrical circuit in order to light up the bulb.

Science:

In Science we will be looking at 'Living Things and their Habitats'.

We will be classifying various plants and animals and will explore various Animal Kingdoms. As part of science investiga-

tions, we will explore soil habitats and describe different types of Fungi. The scientist we will explore during this topic is Carl Linneus.



Maths:


In Maths, both y5 and 6 we will be learning about the value of numbers up to a million.

This will include using place value mats to recognise the value of each individual number, rounding numbers, learning about negative numbers whilst year 5's will also be using roman numerals to solve problems.

All these skills will be used to develop a further understanding of addition and subtraction which will form the latter part of this half term.

English:

Our class novel this half term is the book 'Floodland'. We will be exploring at the idea of a dystopian future and hot seating as characters to better understand the text. We will also be writing a letter. We will also be planning, writing and editing a formal persuasive speech.



VIPERS

Our reading vipers text will also be focusing on the story of 'The Last Wild'. The VIPERS skills we will focus on prediction, fluency and questioning. We are going to be focusing on all the different types of questions we may see for these skills.



PE:

Children will be having PE twice a week. On <u>Wednesday</u> children will have athletics with a sports coach. On <u>Monday</u> children will have PE sessions focused on improving agility and previously learnt techniques. Please ensure PE kit is brought on the day for children to change in to.

PSHCE:

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Being me in my world

We will identify our goals for this year, understand my fears and worries about the future and know how to express them. We will explore the universal rights for all children.

MFL:

In French, we will be recapping basic sentences and phrases



learnt last year so we can hold conversations with each other. We will also be learning numbers up to 20 and will learn the nouns of classroom objects.

How parents can help at home:

We are focusing on reading and writing this year. Reading really accelerates children's writing so please read at home. Keep supporting your children with Seesaw to access homework which is set each Friday. Children are encouraged to practise their weekly spellings and timetables on Spelling Shed and Times Tables Rock stars.

Days/Dates to remember:

- PE is on <u>Mondays</u> and <u>Wednesdays</u>. Children will need to come into school in their full school uniform with their PE kit in a bag to change in to.
- Homework is set on Seesaw on Friday. Spellings are set on Mondays. Spelling tests will be on Fridays that week.
