## 'We can and will succeed'

#### Class Topic: Let's Celebrate

We will be exploring different festivals this half term. We will look at festivals such as Diwali and



Christmas and how this is celebrated throughout different countries. We will also look at Bonfire Night and the importance of staying safe during these festivals and as it gets darker leading up to Christmas.

#### Seasons

Learning about the seasons will continue throughout the year. We will be learning about seasonal changes and key features of Autumn. The children can discover natural autumn resources in our investigation area.

# Knowledge and Understanding of the World:

Birthdays - how have we changed since we were a baby?



Exploring light and dark. How can we see in the dark?

Christmas - looking at photographs of different countries around the world where Santa delivers presents to.

# Maths: Comparing amounts, size, mass and capacity. Using simple patterns.

The children will learn how to compare amounts and notice differences between sets using mathematical language such as more than, less than or the same.

Children will explore copying and creating their own patterns.

We always sing Number Songs every week and have a weekly song which we know well.

#### English:

The children will enjoy listening to and joining in with our stories this term.

Our books are: Funnybones, Diwali stories, Leaf Man, Peace at Last, Whatever Next and a special collection of Christmas stories.

#### Phonics:

We will be following Phase 1 phonics by playing lots of listening games to listen to different sounds and improve our focus.

#### Physical Development:

- ♦ Be increasingly independent as they put on and do up their coats.
- ◆Gross motor skills outdoor play for skipping, balancing and jumping. Use large muscle movement to wave flags and streamers.
- ◆ Children to start showing a preference for a dominant hand and use one handed tools and equipment.



### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Celebrating Differences - pieces 1 to 6.

We will be focusing on the following topics:

What I am good at?, I'm special, I'm me!, families, houses and homes, making friends and standing up for yourself.

### Creative Development:

- ◆ Linking colours to festivals.
- Firework pictures and models
- ♦ Making Divas.
- Listening to music and making their own dances in response.
