# Message from the staff:

Welcome to all the parents/carers of class Sycamore. We hope you have had a relaxing and enjoyable half-term break and are ready for the new half-term ahead of us. We have lots of exciting learning planned for this half-term and we hope the children will be excited to share this with you.

# Class Topic:

This half-term, we are focusing on history in our topic lessons. Our topic is Ancient Greece. We will be exploring the key events that happened during the Ancient Greek's civilisation and compare and contrast



Athens and Sparta. We will also examine Alexander the Greats empire and understand the religious beliefs of the Ancient Greeks and their Gods. We will undertake research about the ancient Olympic games and discuss the influence of Ancient Greece in the modern world.

### Science:



In science

this half term, our topic is 'Properties and Changes of materials.' We will be exploring materials, to consider how materials can be changed and adapted. This is presented in various ways, such as chemical and physical changes. Pupils will discover more about the molecular structure of materials, in simple terms, and gain an understanding of changes that are reversible and irreversible.

### Maths:

In maths, both years 5 and 6 will be learning about multiplication and division and fractions. Pupils will learn how to add, subtract and compare fractions. Some year 6's will be learning how to multiply and divide with fractions, going into further depth. Pupils will be able to recall previous knowledge on fractions and build upon it this half term. These skills will allow better understanding of the topic which will be further built upon later in the year.

# English:

Some children will be reading The Adventures of Odysseus this half term. All writing pieces will be based around this book, which means children will learn and take part in a wide range of skills, such as, role play, hot seating, book talks and in-depth class discussions. These skills will be used to build up to a large variety of writing opportunities. These include: information texts, newspaper reports and story writing.

VIPERS

We will be learning to answer comprehension questions based on prediction, retrieval and vocabulary using short extracts as well as fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.
